Having our own Sort Code means we have a domestic UK bank code for internal UK GBP payments.

When a payment is made with our Sort Code from another bank or payments institution, the Sort Code will route the payment to Wirepayer. The Account Number will then identify the client account with Wirepayer to credit the payment to.

Our Sort Code is connected to the UK's internal Faster Payments Scheme (FPS), this means payments will arrive almost instantly. All our clients will use our Sort Code for domestic GBP bank transfers.

You can find your bank's Sort Code normally on your bank statements, online accounts, phone app or on the debit card issued by your bank.

Sort Codes are different from SWIFT Codes as SWIFT (or BIC) numbers are used for international bank transfers. The SWIFT Codes are similar to Sort Codes as they are used to identify the bank that the funds need to end up at, but is a standardised method of identification across the globe.
